Have some fun; mingle with your neighbors and find some great deals when you shop.



Tips to Maintain and Increase your FICO Score

If you've had some credit troubles in the past not to worry there is an easy fix. The "fix" will take effort, consistency, and time. With these actions you can increase your credit score in as few as 6 months.

LET'S BREAK DOWN YOUR FICO SCORE

By the way what the heck does "FICO" stand for? Fair Isaac Corporation

35% Payment history

30% How much you owe aka the percentage of use on each of your accounts

15% Length of credit history

10% New credit10% Credit mix

FIRST LET'S START WITH WHAT <u>TO DO</u>

Pay down revolving debt to 30-40% of the credit limit

Establish a 2 year credit history with at least 3 different creditors AND pay on time.

Have a mix of revolving and installment debt. Installment refers to a set number of months that the debt will be paid off with set monthly payments such as an auto or mortgage loan.

NOW THE TOUGH STUFF WHAT NOT TO DO

Open multiple accounts in a short period of time Have your credit run more than 3 times in 90 days Close unused credit accounts C0-sign for anyone, ever

Co-sign on Student Loans even if there is a deferred payment

WHAT ABOUT COLLECTIONS AND CHARGE-OFF's?

Collections will be assigned a "payment" based on the balance due Charge-off's between \$250-\$1,000 they must be paid in full Charge off's between \$1001-\$5,000 do not have to be paid

I'VE HAD A SHORT-SALE; A FORECLOSURE; A BANKRUPTCY

You can buy a home again after 3 years of seasoning with an FHA loan

ARE THERE ANY LOAN PROGRAMS THAT OFFER DOWN-PAYMENT ASSISTANCE?

Yes, many. Minimum FICO score is 640

Earthquake Preparedness

- April is Earthquake Preparedness Month so now is a great time to take steps to be better
 prepared for an earthquake. We need to be prepared for any disaster or major incident. The
 steps taken to prepare for an earthquake will prepare us for any disaster.
- Make sure neighbors know one another and their families.
- Meet to discuss potential threats to your families and properties, and how everyone can work together to protect each other.
- Review and practice your neighborhood's disaster plan each year. If you don't have a plan, create one.
- Learn First Aid and CPR.
- Encourage your neighbors to practice their individual family disaster plans.
- Another important part of disaster preparedness is compiling supply kits for your home, work and vehicles. Include in each of your kits:
- Enough food, water, clothing, medications, cash and First Aid supplies for all family members to survive for at least 5-7 days. Update them yearly.
- Instructions to locate and turn off utilities.
- An out-of-state contact list. Long distance calls may go through when local services are
 unavailable. Make an out-of-state contact your primary resource in the event of a disaster. You
 can utilize the "Safe and Well" registry created by the Red Cross which allows individuals to
 "check in" to notify family members of their wellbeing. Individuals who register can also leave a
 brief message.
- For many people, pets are considered family members, so plan to keep them safe in the event of a disaster as well. Pet owners can follow these tips to keep their pets safe and comfortable:
- Create a pet-friendly first-aid kit that includes flea and tick medications, latex gloves, and even a first-aid book or pamphlet geared toward animals.
- Create a checklist of relevant items that will help your pet survive an emergency. Keep this
 checklist close to your emergency kit or with your personal belongings, to make sure you don't
 forget anything.
- Include chewing toys, blankets, bedding, and other items that your pet loves. If your pet can play
 with something familiar, she or he could feel more relaxed during an emergency situation.
- Keep a pet carrier and/or litter box with newspaper, paper towels, bleach or cleaning solution, and plastic bags. If you need to evacuate your home, you'll want to be able to take care of your pet's needs.
- If the emergency entails environmental smoke or loud sounds in your neighborhood, bring your pet inside and try to keep them in a safe, quiet place.
- License and microchip your pets. When pets have a valid license and a microchip with current
 information, they can be more easily reunited with owners during a disaster or emergency. Make
 sure your pets' contact information is current.
